

How to build a coffin.

Materials Needed:

- Plywood or reclaimed wood
- 2x4 lumber
- Screws and nails
- Saw (circular or hand saw)
- Drill
- Measuring tape
- Sandpaper
- Paint or stain (optional)
- Hinges (if you want a functional lid)

Steps to Build the Coffin:

1. Design and Measure:
 - Decide on the dimensions of your coffin. A typical size might be around 6 feet long, 2 feet wide, and 1.5 feet deep.
 - Draw a template for the coffin shape. You can go for a traditional “toe-pincher” shape or a rectangular box.
2. Cut the Wood:
 - Cut the plywood or reclaimed wood for the sides, bottom, and lid of the coffin.
 - For a toe-pincher shape, cut the sides at an angle to create the tapered look.
3. Assemble the Frame:
 - Use the 2x4 lumber to create a frame for the coffin. This will provide structural support.
 - Attach the frame pieces together using screws and a drill.
4. Attach the Panels:
 - Attach the plywood panels to the frame using screws or nails. Start with the bottom, then the sides, and finally the lid.
 - If you want a functional lid, attach it with hinges.
5. Sand and Finish:
 - Sand all the edges and surfaces to remove any splinters and rough spots.
 - Paint or stain the coffin to your desired finish. You can also add decorations or team logos.
6. Add Wheels (Optional):

- If the race rules allow, you can add wheels to the bottom of the coffin for easier movement.
